

Duty Team - Responsibilities

The duty team is responsible for:

BEFORE the Game:

- Check net heights are set correctly (see photo below)
- Equipment is present: Game balls, score sheet, whistle, iPad for scoring
- Share iPad screen with TV screen
- Manage warm up and game time (as listed below)
- Check court and equipment is fit for use
- Ensure team captains tick score sheet to mark attendance
- If game is a forfeit – mark score sheet

WARM-UP (5 minutes):

- 2 minutes – passing warm-up
- 2 minutes – hitting warm-up
- 1 minute – serving warm-up

GAME (40 minutes):

- Provide a minimum of a 1st referee & a scorer
- May also provide 2nd referee, 2nd scorer and lines people
- Scorer signs the score sheet and collects signatures from captains at end of game

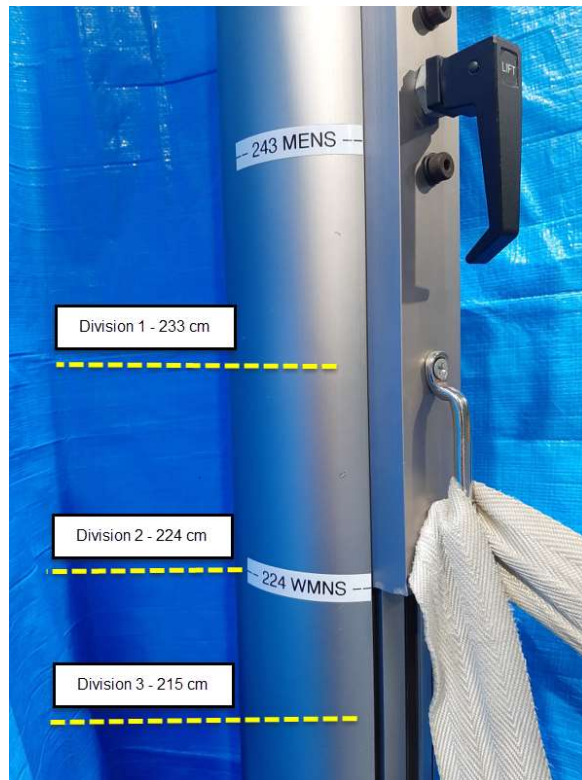


Figure 1: Net heights – net height shown in picture is 224cm for Division 2

Competition Rules (summary)

Game Format

- Maximum 4 sets – played to time cap
- Divisions 2 & 3: Rotate server after winning 3 consecutive points on serve
- Divisions 2 & 3: Unlimited substitutions and exchanges between points, from either side of the court
- Division 1: Substitutions and Exchanges *should* follow FIVB rules (noting that a second referee may not be present)
- 45-minute scheduled time comprises; 5 minutes warm up & 40 minutes game time

Set Points

- To win the set, a team must win 15 points AND have a winning margin of 2 or more points. (Play continues until a winning margin of 2 points is achieved)
- For the final set to count, either team must have scored 8 points or more by the time cap
- If final set is cut short by time cap, providing minimum points rule is satisfied; even points is a draw, win by 1 point or more is a set win
- A bonus point is awarded for winning all sets in a game

Minimum Number of Players

- To avoid forfeit: Teams must have 4 players registered for their team present on court
- To avoid forfeit: Teams must have a minimum of 5 players on court
- Teams may include (1 or 2) 'guest' players to make up to 6 players on court
- 'Guest' players must be current financial members of both VQ and GVA
- 'Guest' players playing 'down' a division must modify play to suit the division in which they're playing – GVA committee members may warn and/or remove 'guest' players from a game (even if it means a team then forfeits the match)
